Safety Concerns—Given the fact that the winter weather is soon to be upon us, it is important to review some safety procedures for arrival and dismissal times. Please be aware that 52nd Street is now one-way going west at arrival and dismissal. Drivers are expected to observe the signs as posted on the barricades during these times. Cars should never be driven along the east side of the building or in the alley behind school in order to drop-off/pick-up a child at the East Door. Usually the horses are up preventing drivers from using that space as a driveway, but following a snowstorm they have either been moved to allow the area to be plowed or are buried in the snow. Please respect these directives to insure the safety of the children who enter at the East Door.

In inclement weather, all students may be dropped off at the South Door and enter the building there. The traffic pattern which allows this to work the best is for cars to enter the South Lot via Austin and proceed to the South Door and exit at McVicker. Since parking spaces are usually limited due to snow mounds, there is no need to park the car. Just pull up and drop your child at the door. Patrol people are there until 8:05.

Your compliance with these procedures insures the safety of our students.

ATTENDANCE POLICY CLARIFICATION—Parents are required to report their child's absence to the office by 9:00 A.M. When the child returns to school following an absence, he/she must bring a note from the parent or guardian. The note must contain the following information:

- 1) Date of the note,
- 2) Name of the student,
- 3) Date(s) of the absence,
- 4) Reason for the absence, and
- 5) Signature of parent or guardian

Both the telephone call the morning of the absence and the written absentee note are required. Please comply with this policy as it insures the safety of the children.

UNIFORM REMINDERS—Please be aware that students are expected to wear dress shoes (ie loafer or oxford-style shoes). When boots are worn to school they are to be removed and school shoes are to be worn during the school day. In addition, only SJS sweatshirts are to be worn to school. Please make sure that your child(ren) are properly attired for school.
